In addition to acting, Hubbard has a lot going on. She not only founded a youth based nonprofit organization, The Erica Hubbard Foundation, but she released a collection of children's books entitled "You, She, Her, Him, and I."

"You have to be focused, you have to be driven, be responsible, on time and be personable," she advises those aspiring to begin careers in the industry.
